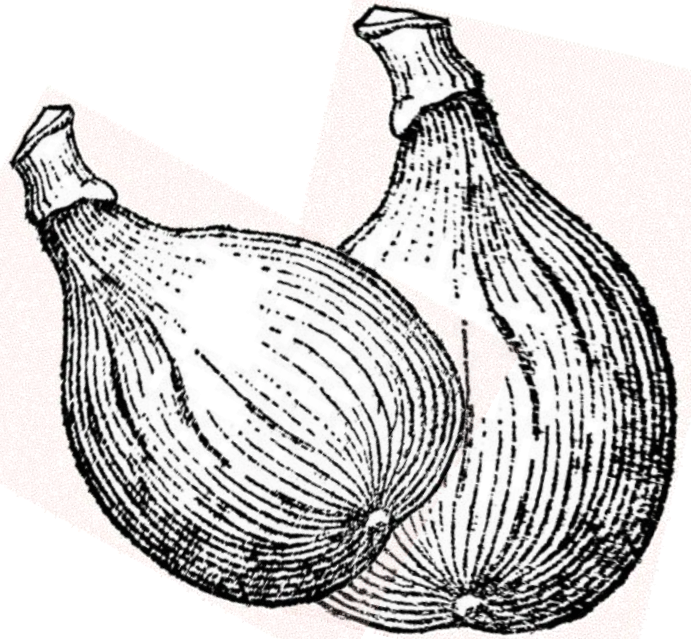
**\*\*Directions:** For the “fun” page of each letter, allow your children to color them, glue them to colored cardboard or cardstock and have you laminate and cut out.

## **Fig Fun Facts:**

- ⇒ Fig trees have no blossoms on their branches. The blossom is inside of the fruit! Many tiny flowers produce the crunchy little seeds that give figs their unique texture.
- ⇒ The fig (and it's parts - fig tree, fig leaves, etc.) is found throughout the Bible, with it's first appearance in the first book of Genesis, and it's last stand in the final book of Revelation.
- ⇒ A half a cup of figs provides as much calcium as a half a cup of milk.
- ⇒ There are over 800 species of figs.
